**Minneapolis Golfers Raise \$12,000 to Help End Global Poverty  
at the Partnerships*InAction* Golf Tournament**

**Minneapolis, Minnesota – August 11, 2008** – Today at the Majestic Golf Course, 45 golfers took a swing at ending global poverty at the annual Partnerships*InAction* Golf Tournament. Partnership*InAction* Golf is an initiative of Aga Khan Foundation U.S.A. (AKF USA) to raise funds and awareness to eliminate hunger, disease, illiteracy and poverty in Africa and Asia. Approximately \$12,000 was raised at today's charity event.

With over half of the world's population surviving on less than \$2 per day, golfers participating at the tournament help communities in some of the poorest areas of Africa and Asia create long-term, self-help solutions to reduce conditions of poverty. 100% of donations and all net proceeds from the Partnerships*InAction* Golf tournament go directly to projects supported by the Foundation; not a cent is spent on administration. AKF USA is a non-profit, tax-exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service code.

The Foundation invests in people to help impoverished communities and families seize the opportunity to move toward greater choice and voice in order to improve their lives. By promoting quality education for girls in Afghanistan, improving health care for mothers and infants in India and placing tools for economic empowerment into the hands of farmers in East Africa, the Foundation helps them build the skills necessary to lead self-sufficient, healthy and dignified lives.

While enjoying a day out on the green with friends and colleagues, Partnerships*InAction* Golf offers Americans an opportunity to create broader awareness about the role that grassroots development projects play in promoting peace and strengthening democracy. Since its launch in 2007, Partnerships*InAction* Golf tournaments have been held in major cities around the U.S. raising nearly \$1 million with over 1,900 golfers and sponsors participating. Throughout 2008 tournaments take place in Atlanta, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, Los Angeles, San Antonio, Seattle and other major U.S. cities. Today's event brought together corporate leaders, entrepreneurs and colleagues, who enjoyed a day of golf while demonstrating their commitment to think globally and act locally in a spirit of social responsibility. Following the tournament, an awards ceremony and dinner were held featuring keynote speaker, the Honorable Satveer Chaudhary, Minnesota State Senator and the first Asian-Indian senator, who spoke proudly of the innovative work of the Foundation.

Partnerships*InAction* Golf is inspired by the tremendous success of [Partnership Walk](#) – an annual event to raise awareness and funds to help people lift themselves out of poverty, now in its 14<sup>th</sup> year in the U.S. Both Partnership Golf and Walk are Partnerships*InAction* initiatives give individuals an opportunity to actively take part in advancing human dignity and peace around the globe through volunteerism, awareness-raising and contributions. Partnerships*InAction* represent AKF USA's growing portfolio of programs including Partnership Golf and Tennis Tournaments, Softball Classic, corporate and professional networking events, film screenings, essay and art competitions, education activities, among others.
