Seattle Golfers Raise \$240,000 to Help End Global Poverty at the PartnershipsInAction Golf Tournament

Seattle, Washington – August 11, 2008 – Today at the Golf Club at Newcastle, 144 golfers took a swing at ending global poverty at the annual PartnershipsInAction Golf Tournament. PartnershipsInAction Golf is an initiative of Aga Khan Foundation U.S.A. (AKF USA) to raise funds and awareness to eliminate hunger, disease, illiteracy and poverty in Africa and Asia. Approximately \$240,000 was raised at today's charity event.

With over half of the world's population surviving on less than \$2 per day, golfers participating at the tournament help communities in some of the poorest areas of Africa and Asia create long-term, self-help solutions to reduce conditions of poverty. 100% of donations and all net proceeds from the PartnershipsInAction Golf tournament go directly to projects supported by the Foundation; not a cent is spent on administration. AKF USA is a non-profit, tax-exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service code.

The Foundation invests in people to help impoverished communities and families seize the opportunity to move toward greater choice and voice in order to improve their lives. By promoting quality education for girls in Afghanistan, improving health care for mothers and infants in India and placing tools for economic empowerment into the hands of farmers in East Africa, the Foundation helps them build the skills necessary to lead self-sufficient, healthy and dignified lives.

While enjoying a day out on the green with friends and colleagues, PartnershipsInAction Golf offers Americans an opportunity to create broader awareness about the role that grassroots development projects play in promoting peace and strengthening democracy. Since its launch in 2007, PartnershipsInAction Golf tournaments have been held in major cities around the U.S. raising nearly \$1 million with over 1,900 golfers and sponsors participating. Throughout 2008 tournaments take place in Atlanta, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, Los Angeles, San Antonio, Seattle and other major U.S. cities. Visit www.partnershipgolf.org for further information.

The inaugural PartnershipsInAction Golf Tournament in Seattle was a grand affair, held on a beautiful sunny summer day. With stunning mountain and city vistas at every hole, the Golf Club at Newcastle's signature course offered first-class amenities to the golfers and guests. The tournament featured varied contests at each hole that excited and engaged golfers throughout the day – ranging from entertaining on-course contests such as Beat the Pro, Bocchi Ball and Cheating for Charity to pampering massages, BBQ grills, ice cream and much more. The tournament was followed by an awards banquet and live auction hosted by emcee, John Curly of King 5 TV and Evening Magazine.

One of the highlights of the event was entertainment from Drum Café that was thoroughly enjoyed by all participants and energized the golfers and audience before the commencement of the award banquet. Mr. Akhtar Badshah, Senior Director of the Community Affairs at Microsoft Corporation delivered a poignant keynote speech highlighting the work of Aga Khan Foundation, noting the partnership between Microsoft's Unlimited Potential program and the Aga Khan Development Network.
